Description

Between my master's degree in psychology in 1998 and starting my scientific career in 2003, I have worked with Antisocial Youth initiating Victim-Offender-Mediation which has inspired my scientific goals ever since. Thus, learning in depth from needs and motivations of violent adolescents, I have devoted my research efforts to investigate the role of mentalization to understand and treat severe offending in adolescence within a frame of developmental psychopathology and to prevent childhood maltreatment which is strongly prevalent in antisocial youth. In the past three years I have established a research institute at the University Hospital of Heidelberg with an outpatient department focusing on regulatory disorders in infancy and family psychotherapy for conduct disordered adolescents. I have complimented our therapeutic services with a mentalization-based parenting program for the German Psychiatry to prevent child maltreatment in families with mentally ill parents that is currently tested in an RCT in two University Hospitals (Heidelberg & Charité Berlin) financed by the German Ministry of Research. Furthermore, we have developed a training for clinicians how to detect child maltreatment and initiate treatment for medical staff within a trial on the effectiveness of a family intervention for mentally ill parents (CHIMPS) financed by the German Innovationfonds.
